- The text piece by Jim Snowden will not be on a window at City Hall. Instead it is flier that sits in a real estate brochure style box at BAM. The text has changed.
- Stone sculpture calling out Miller Freeman and family will have no names on the inscription. The words carved on it will only be:
  - "I am for a white mans pacific coast" and it will be located outside in the drained pool west of the entrance doors.
- Erin's paper mache sculptures will have the text:
  - Born January 27th 1994, the 282nd child born incarcerated at the Minidoka Concentration Camp, Hunt, Idaho. A healthy boy delivered by a horse veterinarian.
  - On this site, Bellevue City Hall and surrounding lands, once stood 60 farms worked on by Japanese American families. These were stripped away by their unconstitutional incarceration during WWII.
