INITIATIVES

ROTATE Q10 – Q13

- 10** Initiative 2066 concerns regulating energy services, including natural gas and electrification. This measure would repeal or prohibit certain laws and regulations that discourage natural gas use and/or promote electrification, and require certain utilities and local governments to provide natural gas to eligible customers.

This measure would decrease funding for investments in transportation, clean air, renewable energy, conservation, and emissions-reduction.

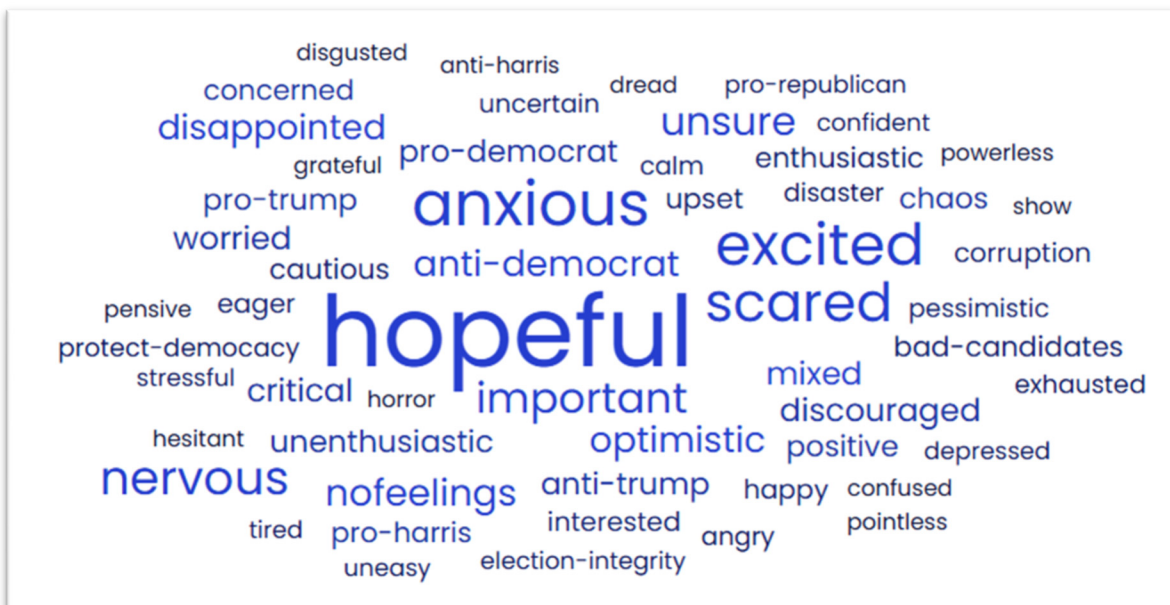
